6. REPORTS BY COUNTY/	Cllr Dawlings reported :		
BOROUGH COUNCILLORS	 Following the local election the Borough Council is represented as follows: Liberal Democrat 16, Conservative 13, Tunbridge Wells Alliance 9, Labour 7, Independent 3. The Liberal Democrats want to form a coalition without the Conservatives. As Leader Cllr Dawlings will try to ensure that all areas have a voice and not just focussed on wards close to Tunbridge Wells. The Parish Council congratulated Cllr Dawlings on his re-election and thanked him for his continued work in Benenden. 		
	 The number of Ukrainian guests is increasing across the borough and plans are underway to try to organise local meeting places. TWBC has paid £150 to all those eligible for energy payments from central government and who pay council tax by direct debit. It is a slower process for those who do not pay by direct debit.

No change to exterior appearance of the properties, no increase in size of structure, existing area of lawn and soft landscaping to front and rear to be utilised as garden/amenity space for the properties, no alterations to vehicular access.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support this application.

- 22/01055/FULL Dene Hollow, Frogs Hole Lane Removal of Condition iii (Agricultural Occupancy)
 of planning approval WE/5/71/115
- SITE CONSTRAINTS: AONB Border, Outside LBD1, Ancient Woodland and others.
- ➤ SITE HISTORY: 09/02874/FULL Replacement dwelling approved. 21/03538/LDCEX Lawful Development Certificate (Existing) Breach of planning condition attached to WE/5/71/115 (condition iii) restricting occupation of dwelling to agricultural occupancy approved
- No Listed Buildings in proximity.
- ➤ GENERAL COMMENTS:
- ❖ Applicants purchased the property in 1982 aware of the Agricultural Occupancy condition but never involved in agriculture, so were in breach of the condition. This was regularised in 2021 under the LDCEX (21/03538).
- This application seeks to remove the agricultural occupancy condition.
- As the existing occupation has been regularised as lawful, it is appropriate to now remove the A/O condition.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support this application.

 22/01271/NMAMD Land adjacent Telephone Exchange, New Pond Road. Non material amendment in relation to window colour, weatherboarding. With application 18/03941/FULL.

The proposal is to change the window uPVC colour from green to white and change the red tile hanging on the first floor to white Cedar Lap Composite Weatherboarding.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to make no comment.

- **22/00655/FULL 2 Hilltop Cottages, Dingleden**. Erection of two storey extension, additional single storey extension to the rear and detached car port.
- Amendment to previous application the Parish Council supported the side and rear extensions to the house but expressed concern about the mass and scale of the car barn which was not part of the application and the Parish Council would not support.
- ❖ Side and rear extensions remain the same and the car barn (2.5 bays) is now included.
- Positioned away from the cottage rather than attached to the extended side elevation and will replace a collection of sheds on site.
- Being detached from the cottage it reduces the bulk and mass and is a better proposal in keeping with the character and appearance of a rural cottage with car barn.

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support this application.

- 22/01120/FULL and 22/01121/LBC Tile Barn House, Standen Street. Internal and external alterations to the Listed Barn to bring it into residential use and to connect it to the existing Oast house along with refurbishment of the Oast House.
- > SITE CONSTRAINTS: 12 constraints listed.
- SITE HISTORY: No previous applications.
- LISTED BUILDINGS IN PROXIMITY: The subject barn is Grade II listed. Timber frame barn clad in weatherboarding on a brick plinth. Half-hipped tiled roof. Off central cart entrance with double doors. 4 bay barn with angled Queen strut roof. Lean to extension. The property immediately to
